



**Illinois Statewide Report of *Clostridium difficile* Infections (CDI) in Acute Care and Critical Access Hospitals,
NHSN LabID Event Reporting, January 1, 2017 – December 31, 2017**

Healthcare-associated infections (HAIs) are infections patients can get while receiving medical treatment in a healthcare facility, these infections are a major and often preventable threat to patient safety. The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) is working with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and other health partners to reducing and eliminating HAIs.



This report is meant to help patients who need inpatient medical treatment decide whether they should be concerned about healthcare-associated infections (HAIs) at the hospital they may choose. Patients should know that these infections are unintended. Ideally, healthcare-associated infections should never happen, but sometimes they do.

It is important for the patients and their family members or advocates to use this information to ask healthcare providers questions before seeking and while receiving medical treatment. Asking the right questions can help patients and family members learn what they can do to prevent infections.

This report looks at positive laboratory results with *Clostridium difficile* (*C. difficile*) bacteria found in stool (feces) in Illinois acute care, critical access, long Term care, and Rehabilitation hospitals. Hospitals are required by law to report these healthcare-associated infections to the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH). This report gives a good overview of how a hospital is doing in preventing healthcare-associated infections. These infections are largely preventable when healthcare providers use infection prevention steps recommended by the CDC. The information in this report can help you to think about whether a particular hospital is the best place for you to receive care. However, there are other things to consider when making a decision about where to get your care. You should use this information as a starting point to ask your healthcare provider questions, and use the answers in your decision making.

Below is a list of all variables shown in the Health Care Associated Infection data tables:

- **Title:** The title of the table gives you information about the infection type, time period, geographic location, and facility type included in the table.
- **Hospital Name:** This is the name of the facility. Facilities with multiple campuses will have each campus identified separately.
- **Observed Infections (or Observed Events):** This is the number of infections (or events, for LabID measures) that was reported by the facility.
- **Predicted Infections (or Predicted Events):** This is a calculated value that reflects the number of infections (or events, for LabID measures) that we have “predicted” to occur in this facility, based on the national experience.
- **“How Does This Facility Compare to Other Hospitals Across the Country?”** Colors and symbols are used to help you quickly understand and interpret the facility’s data. This is the “take-home message” about healthcare-associated infections in this facility.
